The industry's leading provider of engine overhaul for PW1100G-JM, V2500-A5, PW2000, F117 and F100 engines

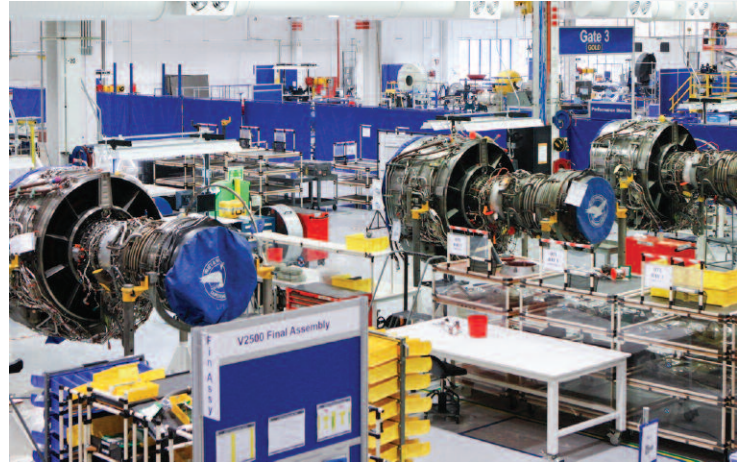


## Overview

- The Columbus Engine Center was originally established in 1996 to overhaul Pratt & Whitney JT8D engines, and transitioned to V2500 engine overhaul in 2002
- The center is North America's leading provider of V2500 engine overhaul, and has serviced more than 1,000 V2500 engines
- In 2011, the center added F117 and PW2000 overhaul capability and, in 2014, F100 overhaul operations were established in Columbus at a new site 1 ½ miles from the main plant
- In 2016, the company announced a \$65 million investment in the Columbus facility to add maintenance capability on Pratt & Whitney's next-generation PurePower® Geared Turbofan™ (GTF) engines, which offer double-digit improvements in fuel consumption, noise, environmental emissions and operating costs.
